spent two Saturdays in January installing a new tile floor in the dining area at St. Peter-St. Joseph Children's Home, saving the institution close to \$6,000 in material and labor costs.

The previous flooring in the 1929 structure was blue carpeting, and James Castro, St. PJ's Home executive director, explained, "The new floor is a huge upgrade for us. It was long overdue, and creates a brighter, cleaner environment."

Castro is now seeking other accessories, to make the space more home-like for residents.

Sam Szalwinski, archdiocesan deputy of the Knights of Columbus, said the group approached St. PJ's last fall and asked Castro about which projects the Knights could offer their assistance towards.

Several businesses and individuals came forward to conduct efforts involving the boy's dormitory on campus, but the dining hall area remained a high priority for renovation.

After agreeing to take on the task, Szalwinski contacted the membership and various councils for support, and received about \$1,600 in donated materials, along with the volunteer labor given on two weekends.

Jesse Aguilar, a member of Council 1070 at St. Gerard's Parish who coordinates youth efforts for the archdiocesan Knights, said the relationship between the Knights and St. PJ's is a strong one, with the Knights holding their annual free throw contest in the St. PJ's gym later this spring.

## Diocesan Deputy Report



Resumption of publication of our Archdiocesan Knights of Columbus Chapter newsletter is most welcome. Thanks to the efforts of Brother Rudy Escamilla. The return of this monthly publication is so important because it provides for another avenue of COMMUNICATION.

Hopefully, most of you remember that when my term as Diocesan Deputy began more than a year and half ago, I distributed lapel buttons that announced, “San Antonio Columbianism needs Coordination, Cooperation and COMMUNICATION”.

We will always need these three elements and the more we do to exercise them, the better our Order will be.

I instituted what I refer to as “Hot Buttons” as another means of COMMUNICATION. These “Hot Buttons” are published monthly to help leaders of our Fraternal organization keep focused on issues, events and projects that I consider important.

These “Hot Buttons” are distributed at our monthly Chapter meetings and appear on my “blog”.

I am taking this opportunity to remark on the status of several matters about which everyone in our Order needs to be aware. We are strong in some areas and we need improvement in others.

**STRONG AREAS:** 1) 100% of seminarians are financially supported either by ASA Councils or by the seminarian’s

home Council. 2) 52 Councils achieved 100% or better in State Charity support and will receive the Quick Start Award. 3) 26 of 31 ASA Councils now supporting the Texas KC Wheel Chair effort. 4) A record number of Councils participated in the October Tootsie Roll Fund Raiser. 5) Special projects such as laying vinyl tile at St PJ’s Children’s Home are well supported. 6) Fourth Degree Turnouts are well supported. 7) Twenty four Round Tables are established. (Goal is 26). And the list continues.

### AREAS NEEDING IMPROVEMENT:

1) Membership goal is 750. As of 1 January, after drops, we reached 250. Need 500!! Tough Challenge but I bet we will do it. 2) Insurance lags just as acquiring new members lag. We need to give our Insurance Agents a viable market. Our members need to protect their families. 3) Nineteen Councils have not joined our State Charity team. (They are at zero)!! 4) Over twenty Councils have not recruited a single member in one year or more!!! 5) Although efforts are underway, we have not re-activated a single Council this year nor have we established a new one. (I hope to see improvement in both areas by next month). 6) Pro life efforts have improved but we have a long way to go. Pray to STOP ABORTION.

So Where Are Our Challenges?

We need to get a lot of support for: 1) Clergy Recognition Dinner on 21 February. 2) Develop and

execute strong Blitz Recruiting efforts, particularly in March. 3) Bishop Flanagan/Habitat/KC golf classic on 12 April. 3) Tootsie Roll Fund Raiser on 10 April. 4) Last Man Standing on 25 June. 5) Attend the State Convention-30 April to 2 May. 6) Achieve 100 % State Charities by State Convention. (Need \$18,000 to reach that goal). PLEASE DO NOT LET ME HAVE TO BEG AT THE STATE CONVENTION LIKE LAST YEAR! 7) Continue to contribute to the American Wheel Chair Mission--\$150 gives mobility to an immobile person.
